



Once again, the government is continuing to provide additional funding to improve the provision of Physical Education and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Department for Education (DfE), Health & Culture, Media & Sport.

Southwark Primary school received £10,500 for the academic year 2015 – 2016 which was ring-fenced and therefore could only be spent on improving and developing the PE and Sport provision at Southwark.

Guidance from the DfE states that the purpose of the premium is to *“fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.”*

At Southwark Primary School, we are extremely proud of the PE & sporting provision we offer our pupils and aim to improve and develop this across the academic year 2016 – 2017. Below is an outline of our priorities to further develop PE provision as well as raise achievement and participation levels for all pupils in sport.

Southwark Primary School PE premium funding priorities:

Priority 2	Increase participation levels in competitive sporting competitions
Priority 3	Improve and develop the quality of PE teaching and learning across the school
